EMPIRE VS BRIGADE

MATCHUP PREVIEW

The first matchup to lookout for is the Albany Empire backfield versus Brigade star quarterback and former league MVP, Randy Hippeard. Hippeard is continuing his success from a year ago, as he's already racked up 12 total touchdowns in the team's first two games, 10 of which were in the air to six different receivers. Hippeard will look to spread the ball around to all of his weapons giving the Empire backfield a challenge to look forward to.

Another matchup to watch out for is Empire receiver, Joe Hills, against Brigade defensive back, Joe Powell. Hills is coming off of back to back Wide Receiver of the Year awards and is looking forward to clicking with Empire quarterback Tommy Grady again. Powell, in his second AFL season, leads the Brigade in tackles, and has chipped in a pass deflection and fumble recovery as well.

Lookout for the reunion between quarterback Tommy Grady and wide receiver Joe Hills. Hills played with Grady in Jacksonville for two seasons and racked up an impressive 100 touchdowns. The four-time All-Arena receiver is looking forward to reconnecting with one of his best friends, Grady, and continuing his incredible active streak of 81 consecutive games with a touchdown reception. In the Empire's first game, Grady threw for five touchdowns and 259 yards.

The entire receiving unit for the Empire will look to give the Brigade issues all night long. Hills will be teamed up with the likes of: Doug McNeill III, Greg Carr, Collin Taylor, and rookie standout, Malachi Jones, giving Grady plenty of options.

THE IFS

If the Empire defeats the Brigade it would...

- * Be the first win in the history of the Albany Empire
- * Give the Empire a 1-1 record for the 2018 season
- * Give the Empire the team's first win on the road

BALTIMORE TIES

- * None of the current Empire coaches have coached in Baltimore.
- * Varmah Sonie is the only player on the Empire's 24-man roster to have played for the Brigade. In 2017, Sonie had 68 tackles, 20 pass breakups, four interceptions and a touchdown while playing in Baltimore.

OPPOSING PLAYERS TO WATCH

Coming off of a last second touchdown loss to Philadelphia a week ago, Baltimore's rebound effort will be led by **Randy Hippeard**. Hippeard was the AFL MVP and Offensive player of the year in 2017 tossing for 3,500 yards and 80 touchdowns a year ago. Hippeard has started 2018 off hot, compiling an impressive 518 yards, 10 touchdowns and no interceptions over the Brigade's first two games.

Of Hippeard's 10 passing touchdowns, he has spread the wealth, finding six different receivers in the end zone in the first two games. Leading the receiving corps is Brandon Tompkins, who tops the team with 11 catches and 132 yards. Brandon Collins, second in yards with 117, leads the team in touchdown catches with three.

THE SERIES

This will be the first time the Albany Empire and Baltimore Brigade compete against each other in AFL history.

THE COACHES

ALBANY EMPIRE HEAD COACH ROB KEEFE

Keefe enters his ninth season as a coach in the AFL. At the age of 29 he became the youngest head coach in AFL history to win an Arena Football League Championship, when he led the Spokane Shock to an ArenaBowl victory in their first year in the AFL. He is the only person in Arena Football history to win an Arena Cup (AF2) and ArenaBowl (AFL) title as both a player and a coach.

As a player, Keefe was a defensive back. During his playing days, he set team records for the Spokane Shock as their all time leader in tackles and interceptions. Making the transition from AF2 to AFL, Keefe joined the Philadelphia Soul, where he won a championship in 2008.

Keefe's first season as a head coach, the Spokane Shock boasted the league's top-ranked defense, allowing a mere 37.6 points per game. The shock won an ArenaCup in that same season.

Posting a career 61-30 record as a head coach in the AFL (#1), Keefe most recently led the Orlando Predators as head coach and vice president of football operations from 2014-2016. In his stint in Orlando, Rob won a division championship in each of his three years leading the team.

VS. THE BRIGADE

This will be Coach Keefe's first time facing the Baltimore Brigade as the coach of the Empire.

BALTIMORE BRIGADE HEAD COACH OMARR SMITH

Smith is one of the most successful players and coaches in AFL history, earning a combined seven AFL championships. Named to the Arena Football Hall of Fame for his storied playing career, Smith enters his second season as the Brigade's head coach. Baltimore qualified for the playoffs in the team's inaugural season, falling to the eventual-champion Philadelphia Soul in the semifinals.

Prior to joining the Brigade coaching staff, Smith spent one season (2016) as the head coach of the LA KISS, earning a home playoff appearance after finishing second in the National Conference. As an assistant coach, Smith won an ArenaBowl title with the Arizona Rattlers in 2012 and 2013 and with the San Jose SaberCats in 2015. Smith won Assistant Coach of the Year in 2013 with the Arizona Rattlers as the team's defensive coordinator. In 2012 and 2013, the Rattlers won consecutive ArenaBowl Championships with a defense ranked second in points allowed per game every season Smith led the defensive unit.

During his nine-year playing career, Smith won four ArenaBowl titles (2002, 2003, 2004, 2007) and finished his career with 35 interceptions, 88 pass break-ups and eight defensive touchdowns.

VS. THE EMPIRE

This will be Coach Smith's first time facing the Albany Empire.

EMPIRE LEADERS

WHAT'S AT STAKE: The Albany Empire look to bounce back from an inaugural game loss to the Philadelphia Soul on April 14. The team will play their first road game as they travel to Baltimore to matchup against the 2017 AFL MVP; Randy Hippeard and look to avoid an 0-2 start to the team's debut season.

LEADING THE WAY: QB Tommy Grady had a solid statistical game despite the loss to Philadelphia. At the helm of the offense, Grady tossed five touchdowns to four different receivers. The former AFL MVP has high expectations to bounce back and is excited to throw to his favorite target again; Joe Hills.

LOOK OUT FOR: WR Joe Hills, will make his Empire debut in the team's second game against Baltimore. A late week addition on the team's bye week, Hills reunites with Grady after playing in Tampa Bay for a season. Hills' first stint catching footballs from Grady included two seasons and a whopping 100 touchdowns. Hills currently holds the record for most consecutive games with a touchdown catch (81); a streak that is still active.

DON'T SLEEP ON: WR Malachi Jones, impressed fans in his first ever AFL game with a 48-yard catch and run touchdown, breaking tackles and showing off his blazing speed. The Appalachian State grad will look to continue his success as he lines up opposite of Empire's star-studded receivers.

SPARK FROM THE FULLBACK: FB Wes Mauia, gave the Empire offense a boost in the second half with an impressive 37 yard run straight up the gut of the Philadelphia Defense. In a pass-dominated game, don't be surprised to see Mauia taking a handoff or two and breaking out for a big gain.

LOCKDOWN BACKFIELD: Being a defensive back himself, Keefe loaded up the backfield with ball-hawking AFL veterans. As if the defensive line wasn't striking fear in opposing quarterbacks enough, the backfield will make sure that opposing receivers will have a long day trying to get open against the Empire. Varmah Sonie, Marrio Norman, and Arthur Hobbs are just a few of the names to look out for in the backfield.
