The Brigade are on the road this weekend, taking on the Albany Empire on Saturday, June 2 at 7 p.m. at Times Union Center in the first of two-straight matchups between the AFL's top teams. Both Baltimore and Albany enter the weekend on four-game win streaks, including double-digit wins last week.

BRIGADE PLAYER TO WATCH: QB Randy Hippeard – Hippeard leads the AFL in completions (134), attempts (193) and passing yards (1,438) and ranks second in passing touchdowns (28). Hippeard has been named game MVP in four-consecutive outings and all five of Baltimore's wins this season. In Hippeard's last outing against Albany, he threw for season highs of 290 yards and seven touchdowns.

EMPIRE PLAYER TO WATCH: QB Tommy Grady – Grady ranks second to Hippeard in completions (118), attempts (181) and passing yards (1,405) and leads the AFL with 34 passing touchdowns. Grady is coming off one of his best performances of the season – a six-touchdown, 237-yard game in which he completed 73.9 percent of his passes.

MATCHUP TO WATCH: Brigade WRs vs. Empire DB Marrio Norman – The Brigade receiving corps provides a balanced attack – eight different players have caught touchdowns this season, including four players that have caught four or more. The Empire defensive backfield is led by Marrio Norman, whose 36 total tackles rank second on the league. Norman tallied a season-high eight solo tackles against the Brigade in the teams' lone matchup this season.

Veteran defensive back Virgil Gray, named Defensive Player of the Week for his 12-tackle performance in Week 3, leads the way for the Brigade defense. Gray ranks first in the AFL with 45.0 total tackles and two interceptions.

BENSON RETURNS TO ACTION

Earlier this week, the Brigade signed longtime AFL veteran fullback Mykel Benson. Benson has not played since last season with the Philadelphia Soul, but ranks in the top five in league history in rushing attempts, rushing yards and rushing touchdowns.

The local group partnered with the ownership group of the Philadelphia Soul of the Arena Football League, led by Ron Jaworski, Craig Spencer, Dick Vermeil, Marques Colston, Jahri Evans and other Philadelphia area businessmen.

“I could not be more excited to be part of the group bringing Arena Football back to Albany,” said Empire co-owner Dan Nolan. “We are bringing back a sport that has proven to be endeared by this city, and bringing it back with a great group of dynamic business leaders, football experts and all around great people.”

“Having the highest level of Arena Football back in the city of Albany is going to be amazing,” said team co-owner George Hearst III. “This team will be a pillar in the community for years to come. Our unique ownership group, which includes local passion with proven AFL and sports operating expertise ensures we will have the first-class business operation that this city deserves.”

Prior to joining the Brigade coaching staff, Smith spent one season (2016) as the head coach of the LA KISS, earning a home playoff appearance after finishing second in the National Conference. As an assistant coach, Smith won an ArenaBowl title with the Arizona Rattlers in 2012 and 2013 and the San Jose SaberCats in 2015. Smith won Assistant Coach of the Year in 2013 with the Arizona Rattlers as the team's defensive coordinator. In 2012 and 2013, the Rattlers won consecutive ArenaBowl Championships with a defense ranked second in points allowed per game every season Smith led the defensive unit.

During his nine-year playing career, Smith won four ArenaBowl titles (2002, 2003, 2004, 2007) and finished his career with 35 interceptions, 88 pass break-ups and eight defensive touchdowns. The Torrance, California native graduated from San Jose State University and is tied for second on the school's career interceptions list with 13. CEDRIC WALKER **DEFENSIVE COORDINATOR**

Walker, who will lead the defense as defensive coordinator, boasts nearly 20 years of arena football experience, including ten years as a player (Charlotte, Orlando, Arizona, Albany, Chicago, Austin, Las Vegas) and nine as a coach (Bakersfield, Everett, Tri-Cities, Green Bay, Milwaukee, San Jose), including the last six seasons of his coaching career as a defensive coordinator. Walker won ArenaBowl XXVIII as defensive coordinator of the San Jose SaberCats in 2015 and ArenaBowl XI as a player with the Arizona Rattlers in 1997.

JAMES ROE **OFFENSIVE COORDINATOR**

Roe enters his second seasons as the Brigade's offensive coordinator. During his playing career, Roe won three ArenaBowl titles (2002, 2004, 2007), all with the San Jose SaberCats. BRIGADE BEAT VALOR, 61-56, IN SEASON OPENER

Hippeard named MVP for seven-touchdown game

BALTIMORE, MD — The Baltimore Brigade (1-0) opened their 2018 season with a win, topping the Washington Valor (0-1), 61-56, Friday night at Royal Farms Arena in Baltimore, Md. Brigade quarterback Randy Hippeard threw for five touchdowns and ran for another two on his way to winning the game's Most Valuable Player award.

"We came out and we found a way to win," Brigade Head Coach Omarr Smith said after the game. "I'm proud of the way we played offensively...to be able to go out and win the first game is important for us. We're all about trying to improve from last year. It feels good to be 1-0, but we have to enjoy it for 24 hours and then get back to work."

Baltimore got on the board first when quarterback Randy Hippeard, the AFL MVP in 2017, connected with wide receiver Kendrick Ings for the game's first score, giving the Brigade a 7-0 advantage. Minutes later, Hippeard notched his first rushing touchdown of the season and gave the Brigade a two-score lead early in the first quarter. Davila found wide receiver Chris Duvalt for Washington's first score of the season late in the opening quarter. Another Hippeard passing touchdown, this time to Brandon Thompkins, who is playing in his second season with the Brigade, gave Baltimore a 20-7 lead after the first quarter. Davila tossed his second score of the game to Rod Windsor to bring the game back within one score. Baltimore and Washington traded scores throughout the remainder of second quarter, which ended with another Hippeard rushing touchdown as time expired on the first half, giving the Brigade a 40-28 lead.

Davila started off the second half scoring with a 17-yard rushing touchdown, cutting the Baltimore lead to 40-35. Wide receiver Brandon Collins answered for the Brigade, hauling in another Hippeard touchdown to make the score 47-35. Davila and Hippeard traded passing touchdowns, keeping the game within two scores for the entirety of the fourth quarter. With under one minute remaining, Davila found Windsor for their third scoring connection of the game, setting the final score at 61-56.

BRIGADE FALL, 54-49, TO DEFENDING-CHAMPION SOUL

Hippeard throws five touchdowns, zero interceptions for second-straight week

PHILADELPHIA, PA — The Baltimore Brigade (1-1) dropped a 54-49 final to the defending-champion Philadelphia Soul (2-0) Saturday night at Wells Fargo Center in Philadelphia. Brigade quarterback Randy Hippeard threw for 278 yards and five touchdowns, including two to wideout Brandon Collins. Philadelphia wide receiver Darius Reynolds was named Offensive Player of the Game for his 151-yard, four-touchdown performance.

After Philadelphia scored on the game's opening possession, the Brigade answered with a pair of Hippeard-to-Collins touchdowns, taking a 14-6 lead less than a minute into the second quarter. Collins' scores of 22 and 38 yards earned him his first multi-touchdown game of the season. Fullback Jeramie Richardson's one-yard rush brought the Soul back within a point before Brigade wideout Quentin Sims grabbed his second touchdown of the season – a 15-yarder from Hippeard with just over five minutes left in the second quarter. Baltimore's onside kick attempt on the following possession failed, setting up Soul quarterback Dan Raudabaugh's second touchdown pass of the night – a 10-yard throw to wide receiver Darius Prince – bringing the score to 21-20, Baltimore. On the ensuing kickoff Philadelphia attempted an onside kick of their own, but Brigade defensive back Joe Powell grabbed the ball out of the air and walked it in for a touchdown, giving Baltimore a 28-20 lead with 1:29 left in the first half. Raudabaugh found Reynolds for another score on the next possession, bringing the Soul within one point going into halftime.

Brigade wideout Brandon Thompkins tallied his first kickoff return touchdown of the season, extending Baltimore's lead to 35-27 on the first play of the second half. Consecutive Philadelphia touchdowns – both passes by Raudabaugh – gave the Soul a 41-35 lead with 10:11 left in the game. Baltimore regained the lead, 42-41, with just over five minutes remaining on a short pass from Hippeard to tight end Jordan McCray. Richardson found the end zone once again on another one-yard rush, giving Philadelphia a 48-41 lead with one minute left in the game. Hippeard found wide receiver Milton Williams across the middle of the field for an 11-yard touchdown to retake the lead, 49-48, with 31 seconds left on the clock. A pair of Reynolds catches covered 34 yards, setting up Philadelphia with a chance to win. On second down from the nine-yard line, Raudabaugh found Reynolds at the goal line for their fourth scoring connection of the night, giving the Soul a 54-49 lead with 12 seconds remaining. Philadelphia held Baltimore out of the end zone on a Hail Mary attempt as time expired to seal the win.

BRIGADE DEFEAT EMPIRE, 52-49, IN TEAMS' FIRST-EVER MEETING

Baltimore improves to 2-0 at Royal Farms Arena in 2018

BALTIMORE, MD — The Baltimore Brigade (2-1) beat the Albany Empire (0-2), 52-49, Saturday afternoon at Royal Farms Arena. Brigade quarterback Randy Hippeard was named the game's MVP for his seven-touchdown performance. Defensive back Virgil Gray led the Brigade defense with 10 tackles and one interception and was named Defensive Player of the Game.

"It feels good to win," Brigade Head Coach Omarr Smith said after the game. "It's hard to win football games against teams with good coaches and a good quarter-

BRIGADE TOP SOUL, 31-21, TO MOVE INTO FIRST-PLACE TIE

Hippeard throws four touchdowns, wins third game MVP of the 2018 season

BALTIMORE, MD — The Baltimore Brigade defeated the defending-champion Philadelphia Soul, 31-21, Friday night at Royal Farms Arena in Baltimore, moving the two teams into a tie atop the league standings. Brigade quarterback Randy Hippeard threw for 207 yards and four touchdowns and was named the game's MVP, his third of the season. Brigade wide receiver Brandon Collins and defensive back Virgil Gray were named Offensive and Defensive Players of the Game, respectively.

"Any time you can hold a team to 21 points, especially someone like Philadelphia, you make a statement," Hippeard said after the game. "It's only going to get tougher...I fully expect to get their best effort the next time we play them."

Baltimore forced a Philadelphia fumble on the game's opening possession, setting up a six-yard touchdown reception for Baltimore fullback Rory Nixon — his first of the season. The Soul answered with a touchdown of their own, tying the game at seven apiece. A 28-yard pass from Hippeard to wide receiver Milton Williams less than a minute into the second quarter gave the Brigade a 14-7 lead. Soul quarterback Dan Raudabaugh and wideout Darius Prince connected for their sixth touchdown of the season to knot the game at 14. With 3:42 left in the first half, Hippeard found Collins for an over-the-wall touchdown that gave the Brigade a 21-14 lead, which held until the halftime break.

After a Brigade goal-line stand with just over five minutes left in the third quarter, Hippeard found wide receiver Quentin Sims for a 42-yard touchdown to give Baltimore its first two-score lead of the game, 28-14. Soul fullback Adrian Ferns found the end zone from one yard out with 13:12 remaining in the game to cut the lead to 28-21. After an eight-minute drive from the Brigade offense, kicker Mark Lewis converted on a 21-yard field goal to give Baltimore a 10-point lead. Gray intercepted Raudabaugh with 2:05 left in the game, allowing the offense to run out the clock and seal the game.

BRIGADE BEAT VALOR, 42-41, IN WASHINGTON, D.C.

Hippeard claims game MVP award for fourth time in five games

WASHINGTON, D.C. — The Baltimore Brigade improved to 4-1 Saturday afternoon, defeating the Washington Valor, 42-41, at Capital One Arena in Washington, D.C. Brigade quarterback Randy Hippeard was named the game's MVP for his 213-yard, four-touchdown performance. Four wins matches the team's win total during the

2017 season.

“We did not start how we needed to but it’s about how we finish,” Brigade Head Coach Omarr Smith said after the game. “It was a good character win – we found a way to win the game.”

In his first drive as quarterback of the Valor, Shane Austin connected on all three passes, including a 23-yard touchdown to wideout Reggie Gray, giving Washington a 6-0 lead just over three minutes into the game. With 7:20 left in the first quarter, Baltimore took a 7-6 lead on fullback Rory Nixon’s second rushing touchdown of the season and his first since Week 1. Austin and Gray connected yet again, this time for a 13-yard score, giving Washington a 13-7 lead with just over a minute left in the opening frame. The Brigade retook the lead, 14-13, when Hippeard found wide receiver Quentin Sims for a 22-yard touchdown with 12:12 left in the second quarter. Austin scrambled for a 27-yard rushing touchdown, giving the Valor a 20-14 lead, but the Brigade answered just a minute later as Hippeard found wide receiver Brandon Thompkins for a 15-yard score to put Baltimore back up by one, 21-20. With just over four minutes left in the first half, Gray hauled in his third receiving touchdown of the day, giving Washington a 27-21 lead.

Baltimore started off the second half with two-straight touchdowns – the first, a seven-yard pass from Hippeard to wideout Brandon Collins, and the second, a six-yard rush by Thompkins – giving the Brigade a 35-27 lead with 7:57 left in the third quarter. Gray grabbed his fourth score of the day, a 24-yarder from Austin, to get the Valor back within a point. Thompkins found the end zone for the third time and second through the air when he and Hippeard connected for a seven-yard touchdown with 13:26 left in the fourth quarter, giving Baltimore a 42-34 lead. Austin notched his second rushing touchdown of the game, punching it in from one yard out, cutting the Baltimore lead to 42-41 with just under eight minutes left in the game. With under a minute to go, the Valor forced a turnover on downs and retained possession of the ball, but were unable to turn it into a points as the Brigade forced a turnover of their own, ending the game.

BRIGADE EXTEND FIRST-PLACE LEAD WITH 54-35 WIN OVER SOUL

Baltimore tops Philadelphia at Royal Farms Arena for the second time this season

BALTIMORE, MD — The Baltimore Brigade (5-1) defeated the Philadelphia Soul (3-3), 54-35, Friday night at Royal Farms Arena, extending their lead in the league standings to 1.5 games over the Albany Empire.

Brigade quarterback Randy Hippeard was named the game's Most Valuable Player for his 210-yard, three-touchdown performance. Hippeard has won the MVP award in all five of the Brigade's wins this season. Baltimore defensive back Virgil Gray recorded six solo tackles and four pass break-ups and was named Defensive Player of the Game.

"Any time you can win in this league you have to appreciate it," Brigade Head Coach Omarr Smith said after the game. "Our guys came in here with a good focus. We made some plays in the first half. Defensively, we made the stops we needed to make. I'm proud of the guys."

The Brigade jumped out to an early 14-0 lead after a pair of touchdown passes from Hippeard – the first, a 26-yard throw to wide receiver Quentin Sims and the second, a five-yard screen pass to tight end Jordan McCray. With 1:06 left in the first quarter, Philadelphia cut the Baltimore lead to 14-7 when wideout Darius Reynolds scored on a 28-yard catch-and-run from quarterback Greg McGhee. Hippeard answered with his third touchdown pass of the night, a 39-yarder to wide receiver Milton Williams, giving Baltimore a 20-7 lead with 12:35 left in the first half. After Philadelphia threw an interception on the following possession, Brigade fullback Rory Nixon scored his third rushing touchdown of the season, giving Baltimore a 27-7 lead. A fumble recovered in the end zone on the ensuing kickoff extended the Brigade's lead to 33-7. With one second left in the half McGhee threw his second touchdown of the night to cut the lead to 33-14.

Defense dominated the early portions of the third quarter. Philadelphia scored the first points of the second half on a one-yard run by McGhee with 7:31 on the clock, cutting the Baltimore lead to 33-21. Nixon's second rushing touchdown of the night put the Brigade back up by three possessions with just over 13 minutes left in the game. McGhee threw his third touchdown of the night, a nine-yarder to wideout Aaron Wascha, making the score 40-28, Baltimore, with 9:50 left in the game. With just over a minute remaining in the game, Brigade linebacker and wide receiver Lamark Brown scored a pair of touchdowns within a 12-second span. Brown first scored on a two-yard run and followed it up with an eight-yard interception return on the following possession. Philadelphia added another score with 39 seconds left, setting the final score at 54-35, Baltimore.

FOR BRIGADE STAR QB RANDY HIPPEARD, A LONG, STRANGE TRIP THROUGH FOOTBALL'S FARTHEST REACHES (BALTIMORE SUN)

The line lodged itself in quarterback Randy Hippeard's brain when he was at Virginia-Wise, a National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics school with no NFL pipeline or even unpaved back road. Maybe he still remembers it because it sounded like something out of "Field of Dreams." Or maybe because he needed to believe it was true:

"It doesn't matter where you are. If you're good enough, they'll find you."

It was enough to keep him going from Virginia-Wise to Switzerland, from one now-defunct indoor-football league to another now-defunct indoor-football league. Enough for him to land in the Arena Football League at age 27 and earn Most Valuable Player honors at 31. Enough for the 32-year-old Hippeard to wonder when an NFL team might find him, reward for a long, strange trip through the sport's farthest reaches.

"There's always a story," Hippeard said Wednesday, ahead of his Baltimore Brigade's game Friday night against the two-time defending champion Philadelphia Soul at Royal Farms Arena. "There's always some guy that started in one of the smaller leagues and then jumped here into another league and then jumped into the NFL. ... There's always a story, and I think everybody that plays in these smaller leagues are hoping they're that next story."

Hippeard's began in Stafford, Va., where he was a three-sport standout for Colonial Forge High. In football, he was an immediate success, as he would be on every team he has played for. And yet his production felt incommensurate with his station, another hallmark of his career.

Despite leading an Eagles team his senior season to a regional final just three years after the program had started varsity competition, he received just two college scholarship offers. "The staff really didn't know too many people, I guess, to call for me," he said. One offer was from Division I Akron; it was rescinded midway through his senior season after the Zips made a coaching change. The other was from NAIA Virginia-Wise, a school with a 3,086-seat football stadium and an athletic department now less than three years removed from a move to NCAA Division II.

Hippeard was not a bystander for long at Virginia-Wise. He started all but three games his freshman year, then every game over the next three seasons, winning 25 of 33 overall, success not since duplicated by the Highland Cavaliers. Even as he rewrote the school's passing records, he said, he never looked into transferring out and up. It was an option; he recalls teammates who "didn't play one snap" moving on to opportunities at Division I schools.

"I think if I had gone to a Division I school, I definitely think things would have probably turned out a little differently for me," he said.

He would have had a pro day before NFL scouts, for one. Or at least would've known that he could attend another school's pro day. "I don't know if they'd had somebody that they thought could play at the next level," he said of the staff at Virginia-Wise. But he'd been told that if he were good enough, they'd find him. So in 2009, he went to Switzerland.

There, in Winterthur, a city northeast of Zürich close to the German border, he reunited with former Virginia-Wise coach Bill Ramseyer. Ramseyer and Hippeard spoke English. Hippeard's teammates, for the most part, did not.

"It was almost one of those things where you had to actually draw it in the dirt so they'd understand what you wanted them to do if you didn't have somebody that could translate it for you at the time," he said. Some of the Winterthur Warriors might understand it on a first run-through; others had never played, just guys looking for something to do after work.

In 2011, back home stateside, Hippeard latched on with the Columbus Lions of the Southern Indoor Football League, chosen for the league's similarity to the AFL. Certainly not for the money. "We made \$200 a game if you won," he recalled, "and \$150 if you lost."

After another season with the Lions, having moved to the Professional Indoor Football League, another league soon to cease operations, Hippeard landed in the AFL in 2013. Last August, he was named league MVP. Four months later, his Tampa Bay Storm folded.

He wonders today what might have been had he started his career in the AFL. Would he have gotten a shot in the NFL by now? Would he be the same resolute, mature person he became? He hopes his story is still being written. He knows it's already a good one. But time is running out.

"He's one of those guys that knows that if he works hard and puts the time in and he stays true to himself," Brigade coach Omarr Smith said, "good things will happen."

BRIGADE ADDS REIGNING AFL MVP FOR SEASON NO. 2 (ABC2 WMAR)

BALTIMORE, Md. (WMAR) - In the offense heavy Arena Football League the quarterback is everything. Now the Brigade has the best QB in the AFL.

"To come here and to be a part of what they were doing and to see who they were bringing in and the pieces they were putting together, it seemed like the right spot for me," said Randy Hippeard.

He is Baltimore's new signal caller and is the reigning AFL Most Valuable Player and Offensive Player of the Year. He comes over from the Tampa Bay Storm.

"We want to be combative, mentally tough, maximum effort, detail sound and accountable," Hippeard added.

"His leadership, his dedication to the game and his willingness to give of himself to win is remarkable," said Brigade Head Coach Omarr Smith.

The Brigade posted a 4-10 record in the franchise's first season. This year Coach Smith says he wants the defense to play more of a role in deciding games.

That defense now includes Virgil Gray. The 34-year-old, six-year veteran stepped away from the field to coach on the Brigade staff last season. His plan was to retire but he had a change of heart.

"I felt like I could still play the game," he said. "My parents, they both wanted me to play and I felt like I kind of owed it to them to continue to play because that's what they wanted me to do too."

"That playing bug wasn't out of his system and now, having that year of coaching experience under his belt, he's going to see the game completely differently," said Smith.

Just like in its inaugural season there is some local flavor on the Brigade roster.

Receiver Daniel Adams is a Maryland native and played for the Terrapins.

Defensive lineman Justin Lawrence went to Morgan State and is one of the best defensive lineman in AFL. He joins the Brigade after winning back-to-back titles with Philadelphia.

"I spent most of my adult life here. I've been here since 2005. I actually live in Columbia now. Baltimore is my second home," said Lawrence. "I won two championships. I want to bring one back to Baltimore, rep my school really well."

The Brigade opens the season on Friday, April 13 when they host the Washington Valor.

IN SECOND ARENA FOOTBALL LEAGUE SEASON, BRIGADE WILL ENCOUNTER FAMILIAR COMPANY (BALTIMORE SUN)

The Baltimore Brigade will kick off their second Arena Football League season Friday night at Royal Farms Arena against the Washington Valor, but if you can't make it to the first meeting of the Ted Leonsis-owned franchises, don't worry.

There will be a second meeting. And a third. And a fourth. And possibly a fifth and sixth in a playoff matchup, too.

With the Tampa Bay Storm folding in December and the Cleveland Gladiators suspending operations for the next two seasons, the AFL is down to four teams, its fewest since the league's inaugural 1987 season: the second-year Brigade and Valor, the expansion Albany Empire and the two-time defending champion Philadelphia Soul.

The Brigade will play each team four times, twice at home and twice on the road, before a guaranteed home-and-home semifinal series. (After finishing 4-10 overall and fourth in the five-team AFL last season, the Brigade lost a one-and-done semifinal to top-seeded Philadelphia.)

The league's veterans are by now accustomed to these scheduling quirks. They also know what such familiarity breeds. First-year Brigade quarterback Randy Hippeard recalled that when his Storm faced the Valor four times in an eight-week span last season, each game seemed increasingly competitive. The result never changed, but Tampa Bay's margin of victory did, from eight and six points in their first two meetings to one and four points in the final two.

"We are creatures of habit," Brigade defensive lineman Justin Lawrence (Morgan State) said. "It's not like we're going to change the way we play one week from week to week. Maybe the schemes will change, but you as a player, you are going to be you."

The teams themselves, though, Hippeard speculated, will look completely different by year's end. Come playoff time, "there's going to be so many new wrinkles that there's no point almost in watching the first half of the season" on film, he said.

That wasn't always the case, of course. Not long ago, the regular season was more than just a runway to the postseason. Brigade coach Omarr Smith played in the AFL during its heyday in the 2000s, when as many as 19 teams vied for an ArenaBowl title. And now?

"We've got four teams," he said. He carried on as if it didn't matter. "On July 28, there's going to be a team that's on a podium, holding a trophy, and on a ring, it doesn't say how many teams are in the league."

Hippeard, the Brigade's top offseason acquisition, is the AFL's reigning Most Valuable Player. The team he won it playing for no longer exists. Among all the AFL's returning players, it's probably the league's best quarterback who best understands what it means to have a career in arena football.

In 2013, Hippeard's AFL tenure began in Tampa Bay. Two seasons later, he signed with the Orlando Predators. After two years there, the franchise suspended operations. Hippeard returned to Tampa Bay last season, leading the league in passing yards and completions and ranking second in passing touchdowns. Then the Storm ceased to exist, too.

"To have to up and leave what we have there, even if it's just for five, six months at a time, it's still a struggle," he said.

Hippeard, 32, and his girlfriend were considering buying a home in Florida when his career rerouted him to Maryland. Those plans are on hold for now, he said. He's living in Annapolis with his girlfriend, an environmental engineer, and a couple of pets. What comes next, he cannot say.

"It's kind of up in the air because if I'm going to continue to play for the next three to five years, where do we want to be?" he said. "So that's kind of where we're looking at now, toward the future."

With only 11 days of training camp under the Brigade's belt, the team is far from a finished product. But Smith highlighted cornerback Virgil Gray, who served on the team's coaching staff last season and last played in the AFL three years ago, and veteran linebacker Dexter Jackson as early standouts.

On offense, wide receivers Milton Williams, Kendrick Ings and Quentin Sims have been impressive, Smith said.

NEW AFL COMMISSIONER RANDALL BOE, A MONUMENTAL EXECUTIVE, OPTIMISTIC ABOUT INNOVATIONS (THE WASHINGTON TIMES)

You've heard that professional football is dying. You've also heard about the leagues, new or reborn, who want to defy that assumption. The XFL, the Alliance of American Football, the Spring League and the Pacific Pro League have all made recent headlines.

As the market grows ever more crowded, the Arena Football League will kick off its 31st season Friday night when two teams owned by Ted Leonsis' Monumental Sports and Entertainment, the Washington Valor and Baltimore Brigade, play in Baltimore.

Randall Boe, Monumental executive vice president and general counsel, was named the league's new commissioner for 2018, and he is not fazed about competition from other football startups. He and the league's executives see an opportunity to "reboot" the league.

"The opportunity to grow the Arena Football League is really very exciting. It's kind of like being in a startup business in a lot of ways," Boe, 55, told The Washington Times. "Fans get excited, it's very engaging, it's fast-paced, so it just seemed like an exciting opportunity at a good moment in time."

The AFL was in danger of folding last month when negotiations for a new collective bargaining agreement weren't going well. Ivan Soto led the players' union and Boe, before being officially announced as commissioner March 27, headed the league's efforts.

"Like every negotiation, there were some ups and downs, and we certainly took it to the last possible minute before reaching a deal, which is typically what happens in any deal," Boe said.

The new CBA includes a 40 percent increase in player compensation and addition of health-care coverage, according to Boe.

"Our goal is to have the highest quality football out there on the field, and you can't do that if you don't fairly compensate your players," he said.

Originally from Iowa City, Iowa, Boe graduated law school at the University of Pennsylvania and went into private practice in Washington. He joined America Online in 1996 and served as its executive vice president and general counsel for 11 years, leading cases during the internet's formative years.

He joined Lincoln Holdings in 2008, before it became Monumental Sports and Entertainment via merger — and long before being a commissioner of a football league was imaginable. He remembers the early days of the AFL with fondness, watching some games during the era of the Orlando Predators' dominance and thinking it was a "pretty novel and exciting version of football."

Now that he is the Roger Goodell of the AFL, don't think Boe will be flustered at the possibly thankless task ahead.

"I remember how fans used to boo David Stern at the NBA Draft every year. I just think that's part of fun," Boe said. "The funny thing about sports, part of being a fan is being critical of the leagues and the teams and the way they're run. ... That passion tells you how engaged the fans are and how knowledgeable they are and how much they pay attention."

Boe said there was no formal search for a new commissioner to replace Scott Butera, who left the post after four years. Nor does Boe have a formal contract of deter-

mined length for the position. Everyone's focus, he said, is to put on a great season of football and start growing the league again.

The AFL has had as many as 19 teams, but by 2017 the number dwindled down to five. Of those, the Cleveland Gladiators and Tampa Bay Storm suspended operations, but could return in the future. Despite the contraction, an expansion team — the Albany Empire — will debut in 2018 and join the Valor, Brigade and Philadelphia Soul. Boe thinks the league will add new teams in the Eastern U.S. before expanding west again.

Why should audiences choose to watch the AFL over the XFL, the AAF or the next string of letters to come along? Boe believes the AFL's product is different — a faster-paced, higher-scoring brand of football, in a league not primarily meant to develop players for the NFL like others do.

And the league's strategy promises innovation. Cameras in players' helmets are being considered, and in a recently announced partnership, DraftKings will stream AFL games on its app and add AFL fantasy sports contests starting in 2019.

"Everyone is looking around the corner at the advent of legalized sports betting on a much wider basis in this country than has existed in the past," Boe said. "We can foresee the day when you'll be watching the game ... and being able to place wagers, proposition bets, on the next play, on different players."

Depending on what else Boe and league leadership foresee and choose to do, they could be poised to turn the AFL around.
